CALGARY CITY TOUR AND CANADA OLYMPIC PARK

Located in the heart of the Canadian West, Calgary, Alberta is home to nearly one million citizens. Once a frontier town, Calgary is a beautiful and vibrant cosmopolitan city nestled in the foothills of the Canadian Rockies. This tour includes downtown Calgary, Stampede Park, and a view of the urban districts. Lunch on your own at Canada Olympic Park, tour the facilities, and enjoy a ride to the top of the 90-meter ski jump. At the Olympic Hall of Fame, browse three floors of displays, highlight films, and exhibits commemorating the 1988 XV Olympic Winter Games.

DISCOVER BANFF

Depart from the hustle and bustle of the city as you pass through the prairies and onto the majesty of the Canadian Rockies. Enjoy a comprehensive tour of Banff and the surrounding area. Sites include Sulphur Mountain Gondola, Bow Falls, Tunnel Mountain, Surprise Corner, and the Cave and Basin--the birthplace of the Canadian National Parks. Your visit to the Cave and Basin will allow you to stroll along nature paths and enjoy the many audio/visual displays located inside the Interpretive Centre. Experience the best views in Banff from Sulphur Mountain--where a fully enclosed gondola will lift you 7,500 feet above sea level for a 360° panorama of mountains, lakes, and the town below. Lunch will be on your own; dine at one of the many fine restaurants in Banff. At the end of the tour, there will be free time to explore and shop in downtown Banff, or enjoy a relaxing dip in Banff's Upper Hot Springs.

BANFF, LAKE LOUISE, AND MORAINÉ LAKE

Legendary scenery abounds as you travel west from Calgary along the Trans-Canada Highway, transitioning from prairies to foothills to mountains. In Banff, take in the highlights of this interesting town while en route to the Sulphur Mountain Gondola--ride in a gondola to 7,500 feet above sea level and enjoy stunning scenery from a superb vantage point. The next stop is the breathtaking Lake Louise--known as the "Jewel of the Canadian Rockies." There you will have time to lunch on your own and partake of a lakeside stroll. The final destination is Moraine Lake, where the mountains are mirrored in Moraine's beautiful jade green water.

DRUMHELLER AND THE ALBERTA BADLANDS

Drumheller and the Badlands are located only 90 minutes northeast of Calgary. This unique setting was created by thousands of years of wind and water erosion, exposing millions of years of geological history. Originally a coal mining town, Drumheller is now a major oil and gas exploration site, and home to the famous Royal Tyrrell Museum of Palaeontology, where the world's most extensive and remarkable collection of dinosaur fossils and exhibits on prehistoric life are on display. Explore and experience 3.5 billion years of the Earth's history, from the development of the planet and its first forms of life to the emergence of dinosaurs, mammals, and the living world of today. The final stop will be the historic Atlas Coal Mine--preserved as one of the best examples of coal mining structures in western Canada, and a National Historic Site. Explore the mine site, its various buildings, and learn about the workings of the tippie.
