CIVIL WAR BATTLE OF GETTYSBURG SESQUICENTENNIAL

In the Summer of 1863, troops from North and South moved through the hills of Pennsylvania, seeking each other out. They met in a small crossroads town for three days that shaped the Nation's history.



Four score and seven years ago our fathers brought forth on this continent a new nation, conceived in liberty, and dedicated to the proposition that all men are created equal.

Now we are engaged in a great civil war, testing whether that nation, or any nation, so conceived and so dedicated, can long endure. We are met on a great battle-field of that war. We have come to dedicate a portion of that field, as a final resting place for those who here gave their lives that that nation might live. It is altogether fitting and proper that we should do this.

Seven score and ten years later, CACers are invited to remember those days.

Come join us, from the North, South, East and West. We have the advantage of already knowing our destination: the town of Gettysburg. Our *Gettysburg address* will be the Eisenhower Hotel and Conference Center (<u>http://www.eisenhower.com/</u>) in the heart of the historic city, and just minutes away from the National Military Park (NMP). The hotel is also within a few minutes of many other attractions, and just a few miles from many more points of interest (*e.g., National Cemetery, Eisenhower National Historic Site, American Civil War Museum, Lincoln Train Museum, Gettysburg Ghost Tours, David Wills House, Hall of Presidents & First Ladies, Gettysburg Walking Tours, and more*). The hotel is served by Gettysburg's *free* Freedom Transit trolley system, with direct access to the National Military Park Visitor Center, Gettysburg Visitor Center & transfer points, and Outlet Shoppes.

On Saturday, there will be a guided tour of the Gettysburg battlefield. From the National Park Service web site, "The Battle of Gettysburg was a turning point in the Civil War, the Union victory that ended General Robert E. Lee's second and most ambitious invasion of the North. Often referred to as the 'High Water Mark of the Rebellion,' Gettysburg was the war's bloodiest battle with 51,000 casualties. It was also the inspiration for President Abraham Lincoln's immortal Gettysburg



Address." We will also see the Gettysburg Cyclorama, and other exhibits at the Visitor's Center, where we will have lunch (http://www.nps.gov/gett/index.htm).

On Friday, for those who arrive early, there will be a trip to the National Shrine of Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton, just eight miles away in Emmitsburg, Maryland. "Learn how the Sisters and Daughters of Charity served the soldiers during the war that divided our nation, and visit the site where Union officers conducted a war council to prepare for the battle of Gettysburg. Hear first hand accounts of rescues, healing, and yes, even miracles on the battlefield." On this trip, we will also



visit the National Shrine Grotto of Lourdes, just minutes away. The Grotto is a recreation of the original shrine in Lourdes, France. (http://www.setonheritage.org/events/civilwar-tours, http://www.msmary.edu/grotto/about/). Friday's tour will include a Mass for our group at the Shrine, and dinner at the Carriage House in Emmitsburg.
